## GIIA President's Message . . . . . From Deb Wagener

**A**s winter continues for all of us and we await the arrival of spring, we are excited by all of 2026 as we reflect on all of 2025. The past year was full of activity, progress, and community engagement here in Glen Isle Estates.

We've welcomed new faces and said fond farewells to others. It was a fun year of events, and we hope you attended some of the gatherings that make our community special.

We enjoyed several memorable events throughout the year. The **75th Anniversary Celebration** was a



fantastic event held at the beach. A huge thank you to all the volunteers who coordinated this wonderful event! All of the holiday events were also well attended and successful at getting

neighbors together for fun memories.

**Several projects were completed last year:**

- A Pier Renovation: Updated decking, plumbing, and lights.
- Clubhouse Exterior: Parking lot repaved; downed/dead trees removed following a storm; Goat weed removal; new cameras installed.
- Clubhouse Interior: TV replaced; dehumidifiers installed in the basement. Deep cleaning service.
- Playground: Baby swing installed; new mulch delivered.
- Beach: Cleanup and weed removal; shower repair; swim raft repaired.

Thank you to everyone who attended our Annual Community Meeting in September. The information shared was vital, especially concerning our five-year capital planning strategy.

Our capital planning committee has been diligently assessing the condition of our community assets and forecasting necessary future improvements. Below, you can see the recap of the discussion and some of the reasons for the recent increase in the covenant fees.



**Overview of GIIA Assets & Estimated Values:**

- Clubhouse & Utilities: (\$600,000+)
- Two Piers (Plumbing & Electrical): (\$200,000+)
- Beach (Replenishment, tables, nets): (\$7,500)
- Beach Gate/Keys/Key Reader: (\$6,000+)
- Playground & Basketball Court: (\$15,000 total)
- Boat Ramp: (\$10,000+)
- Private Roads and Pathways: (\$\$\$\$)
- Land: (Priceless, but upkeep costs money)

A critical piece of information shared at recent meetings relates to Maryland House Bill 107 (2022). This bill now legally requires all HOAs and cooperative housing corporations to conduct professional reserve studies to assess the condition of common elements and estimate future repair costs.

- Goal: To ensure the financial health and safety of community associations.
- Requirement: We must achieve the recommended annual reserve funding levels within three fiscal years of the study's completion and update the study every five years.

In January, the GIIA Board voted to get a professional reserve study started as soon as possible.

Some future planned (or needed) projects and estimated cost are below (*not in any special order or all inclusive*). These projects are essential for maintaining assets.

- Major foundation repair: \$10,000+
- Clubhouse drainage: \$10,000+
- New electric on A Pier (in 2026 budget): \$20-25K
- Clubhouse porch/grounds grading, drainage and improvements: \$50,000+
- Restroom improvements (upstairs/basement): Unknown
- Beach roadway repair and swale: \$6,000
- Beach sand replenishment & new nets: \$5,500+
- Basketball court repair: \$7,000+



## Meet the current GIIA Board

The Glen Isle Improvement Association has a Board of Directors with 6 officers and 9 directors. The board meets monthly to address issues of relevance to the people and properties of GIIA, Inc.

These meetings are now held on 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays at 7:00 pm in the Community Clubhouse, 2724 Pinecrest Dr. All members of GIIA are welcome to attend.

The annual community meeting is held in September, and all GIIA members are urged to attend this as votes are often held on larger matters and expenses. The by-laws of GIIA, Inc. mandate a minimum attendance of members in good standing. In past years, we have surprisingly had trouble meeting that quorum, even with approximately 158 homes in Glen Isle Estates. So, watch your mail in August each year for the date, time, and agenda for the September meeting.

All property owners are encouraged to participate in any way they are able for the betterment of the community. We are always in need of volunteers to help with matters - just reach out to ask any board member how you can help.

To properly fund necessary repairs, meet state requirements, and cover rising expenses, additional revenue is required. The amendment to raise the Annual Covenant Fee to \$600 was discussed by all in attendance. There were requests for additional study of revenue options which the Capital Planning Committee is considering. After much discussion, and a preliminary vote that would have approved the full amount, a motion to only raise to \$500 was shared and a solid majority of those real property owners in attendance approved.

This increase will help to bring in more revenue to meet community needs. We are still left short when comparing 2026 expenses to incoming revenue. Expenses are always increasing and facilities will always keep aging.



The revised approved 2026 budget reflects the only adjustment being the reduction in revenue and decrease in amount categorized for Clubhouse repairs. "A" Pier Electric update was previously approved by the board and funds were allotted for that project. If you have questions about the budget, expenses or any projects, feel free to attend a board meeting. They are held every third Wednesday at 7:00 pm. If you have suggestions, please send them our way.

## Rental fees increase slightly due to funding needs

As we all know, expenses just keep increasing over the years. In February, the GIIA Capital Planning Committee met and discussed many different methods of raising revenue to address both current needs, future plans, and now, the upcoming required reserves.

After much discussion, it was agreed that the least impactful ways to solve some of the issues is to slightly raise fees immediately for both boat slip rentals and for clubhouse rental usage.

It is often cited that Glen Isle has some of the least expensive boat slips anywhere around the Annapolis area. And having that river access is obviously a huge perk of living in this neighborhood. Boat slip fees have remained unchanged for nearly 20 years, and so it was apparent that as costs go up, so must fees. The GIIA Board approved a small increase from \$18 per foot to \$21 per foot to become effective for the 2026 boating season beginning on April 1, 2026.

Similarly, the clubhouse is a hugely useful and wonderful asset to this community. Its modernization with Wi-Fi and air conditioning has helped rentals increase. But, expenses for oil and electricity have also increased substantially and total outgo has often been exceeding income lately. In addition, there are several sizable projects needed to stabilize the grading, landscaping, and water intrusion into the basement that

will have to be undertaken soon. GIIA has opted to raise fees for all weekend and weekday adult rentals to \$180. The fee for children's parties remains at \$50.

Both of these fee increases are permitted by the GIIA by-laws which state that the board has the authority to raise fees without community vote if the increase amount is no more than 20% of the total current fee.

We hope all residents can respect the deliberate decisions behind the changes. If you have comments or concerns email the GIIA Board of Directors, or attend a board meeting any month on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday at 7 pm at the Clubhouse.

# Beach Gate Access Card system to be updated

A policy change made by the GIIA Board of Directors will be affecting your Beach Gate access card sometime in the near future.

At the November 17, 2025 meeting, it was proposed that charging an annual fee for usage of the Beach Gate card would help to increase yearly revenue needed to maintain that system.

After looking into the cost of new beach cards and learning that our current type of access may be obsolete in the near future, upgrades to a new system are being investigated. The GIIA Board will consider the options and make a determination in the next few months.

If you have cards that are not working, turn them in or have them reactivated for a \$25 fee. In the meantime, any new requests for cards will be limited to one card per household as the Board is unable to purchase additional cards. If you have cards registered to your address, new cards are not available without the return of the old cards or deactivation of that number.

Please remember that the beach access is for Residents Only. Do not lend these out to others. The

Board will update the community as we get closer to making changes to the beach access.

## Boat Slip Applications are here Rental season is April 1-March 31

Can it possibly be true? Is spring really showing up as soon as March or April? Yes, it's coming, so get ready today by making sure your boat registration is current and you have all of the proper stickers, paperwork, licenses for fishing, and everything else needed to get out on the lovely water around us!

If you wish to rent a boat slip at the Glen Isle piers OR a kayak storage slot for the 2026 season, rental applications are now available from our long-time volunteer Pier Chair, Brendan McGrath. These forms help him to organize the slips and spaces, handle the fees, and more easily track who has what down at the water during the busy season.

Most recent slip holders should have received an email directly from the Pier Chair about all deadlines and such. Note that fees have recently increased to \$21 per foot of boat length.

There's no date yet set for a launch ramp Key Exchange event, but there will be one held sometime during the spring. It's easiest for everyone if key holders can come to that event, bring along last season's key, and also bring the fee to get a new one if necessary.

## Digital payment for HOA fees

OK folks. The Board heard you and worked to solve an issue. Seems like an easy thing, but there's a bit involved and we want to get it right.

Most of us need to pay our annual HOA fees by March 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. And many don't even own a checkbook anymore. SO, we've activated one digital pay system at this time using the PayPal service, as it allows Venmo, ApplePay, and basic use of credit and debit cards.

There is a fee involved with services and the GIIA Board asks anyone who wants to use this option to pay the 3.49% fee, plus a transaction fee of .30 cents on top of the \$500 due. With rough math, that's about \$18.

It is possible that after usage is studied a bit, this requested fee will change at some point. But, all payers are urged to include the fee

to use this convenience.

The Board Treasurer would like you to include name and address on each payment, and if there are multiple lots involved, make separate payments for each to keep things simple.

We are looking at other payment options such as direct ACH which may incur lower fees. Also being explored is the Zelle app, and online payment through our website using a third party provider, most of whom will also charge fees.

We hope residents will find this technology useful for getting those payments in early each year. Share issues by sending an email: **glenisleestates@gmail.com**. We'll try to have a volunteer respond as soon as possible.

## NOT ACCEPTED at HHW Events

Latex Paint, Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Non-Rechargeable Batteries, or Propane Tanks

*These items are accepted daily at all County Recycling Centers.*



Fire Extinguishers are **NOT** Accepted at HHW Events or at County Recycling Centers.

Fire extinguishers can be brought to BFPE in Hanover, MD. Please call 410-768-2200 to learn more.



During each event, trained personnel will ask you to remain in your car while they unload the HHW from your trunk. To make unloading safe for staff and fast for you: Tightly secure all container lids to avoid leaks and spills, then set your HHW in plastic totes or boxes to contain accidental spills during transport.

- Be prepared to show an Anne Arundel County driver's license and registration.
- Call 410-222-7951 before an event if you have any drums of material.
- Transfer large amounts of fuel into travel-safe gas cans so staff can empty them and return them back to the owner for reuse.
- Keep materials in their original packaging, when possible, and label anything that had to be packed in alternative containers. Never mix different types of HHW in one container.
- Secure your material in your vehicle's trunk, backseat or truck bed, to keep it safely away from passengers during transport.

- This program is for **Anne Arundel County Residents ONLY**.
  - Commercial vehicles and commercial waste are **NOT ACCEPTED**.

### 2026 Application for Marina Slip Fee and Boat Ramp Access

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Marina fees for the 2026 boating season:

Marina slip Rental Fee April 1, 2026 to March 31, 2027	\$21.00 per foot
Renting a slip includes use of the ramp.	
Marina Ramp Access unlimited use April 1, 2026 to March 31, 2027	\$50.00
Member Ramp Fee	\$15.00/per launch
Guest Ramp fee	\$15.00/per launch
Ramp Key	\$10.00
Kayak storage fee	\$25.00

Community and Associate members may rent a slip on a monthly basis. Fees for a monthly rental have been established at 1/3 of the annual rental rate. Members who choose to rent on a monthly basis will be considered temporary tenants, and will not be assigned a permanent slip. Priority will be given to the members who obligate to the annual rental. Upon receipt of three months of temporary slip rental fees, no additional fees will be collected for the remainder of that boating season and the member will be assigned a permanent slip. Temporary tenants will have access to the launching ramp for the period of their slip rental. Temporary rental will begin upon the first date of slip usage and run for 30 or 31 days depending on the days in the month.

Members wishing to apply for annual slip rental beginning on April 1, 2026, should complete and return the attached application to **Glen Isle Improvement Association (GIIA) Attn: Pier Application, P O Box 222, Riva, MD 21140** by April 1, 2026. Please make the check payable to Glen Isle Improvement Association.

**Please include a copy of your boat registration with your application for both marina slip rental and ramp usage.**


