## What's happening in our neighborhood?

### The Beach Bulkhead Project

The work on the bulkhead wall in the beach area got an earlier start than expected and is now complete. Some of the grass on the pathway may have to be re-seeded when the weather cooperates.

This project was approved by the community at the September, 2017 annual meeting. The improvements will help to ensure the prevention of erosion and aid in protecting the shorelines of our beach.

Thanks to those community members who helped to plan the project and reviewed many documents and materials to make sure it all went smoothly.

### Pilings and nets at the beach

The GIIA Board is currently procuring bids on the purchase and installation of some new pilings for the swim beach area at Glen Isle beach. Some of the existing pilings are broken and several need replacement so that we can secure the swim nets to them during our beach season to protect the swim area.

### Summer is coming, so are the bugs

The less than wonderful parts of warmer months – mosquitoes. It's time again and plans are underway.

The GIIA Board has already approved another season of mosquito service at the playground from Mosquito Joe. Results last year seemed promising and reviews were good for seeing an impact.

In addition, Anne Arundel County has once again reached out for communities to participate in the mosquito control program. The application has already been submitted. This will enroll Glen Isle in the weekly spray treatment to help eradicate adult tiger mosquitoes.

Residents are encouraged to assist the effort by working to prevent outbreaks on their own properties.

# GLEN ISLE GOES GREEN

## Introducing the Clean Water Community Project Group

Lots of things are happening around the neighborhood! We are pleased to announce that Glen Isle has been advised that we will receive approximately \$7,500 in funding to use in our neighborhood for a series of smaller scale, stormwater runoff projects. In addition, Watershed Stewards Academy (WSA) of Anne Arundel County will provide the required technical assistance for applicable grants and professional design requirements. As Michael Wagener, one of the group organizers said recently, "This is a really exciting chance for Glen Isle. We have an amazing opportunity to make some real improvements and it's inspiring to see so many residents working together to make things happen."

All of this opportunity is the result of a group of your neighbors who agreed to commit to a 10 hour condensed course on what stormwater remediation projects look like today, and how we can all, as a



neighborhood of 150 homes, make measurable changes to our own water quality.

The CWC group is working in conjunction with the Watershed Stewards as well as the South River Federation to address many environmental issues within Glen Isle. Initial areas of focus will include septic systems, invasive plant removal, pet/animal waste, and bare ground with steady runoff issues.

### Goals for the projects include the following:

- We will share the reality of septic systems, and are planning to host a community sponsored Q&A meeting all about septic systems, including available tank replacement grants, various types of systems available today, and maintenance.
- We will organize an army of weed warriors, called the "Ivy Army," who will seek to protect our trees and open space against all those invasive species.
- We will make it more convenient to pick up after our pets all throughout the neighborhood, and continue to apply efforts to minimizing the goose population in the beach areas.
- We will identify our community's larger runoff problems, and with the help of WSA, determine which ones can be approached through available resources and grants, and support the process on our behalf.

As a result of these overall efforts, Glen Isle will be recognized as a Clean Water Community. And as we move into larger scale projects in the future, such as our beach and shoreline erosion, these efforts will be highly noted and should serve to influence our future success at grant procurement and much more.

It's nice to see a group come together to get some good, green projects done to help the neighborhood.

## Clubhouse rental fees

At the October, 2017 meeting, the GIJA Board voted to increase Clubhouse rental fees by 20%. Community by-laws allow such an increase without community approval (Article VI, Section 12).

The rates went into effect on January 1, 2018. You can find the new rates on the rental forms available on the GIJA website. Clubhouse fees are:

- Weekends: \$120
- Weekdays: \$78
- Children's Party: \$36



## Dumpsters will be here September 10-12

Anne Arundel County's Community Clean-up Program will be bringing the dumpsters to the Glen Isle neighborhood in September. Yes, they usually show up earlier in the year, but this is the date we got.

Large dumpsters will be placed at the Clubhouse parking lot by noon on Monday, Sept. 10th. They will be picked up by 2:30 on Wednesday, Sept. 12th.

This is your chance to get rid of those large items that you do not know what to do with.

DO NOT place the following in the dumpster: gas tanks and propane tanks, tree trunks, oil drums or tanks, hazardous waste, tires, logs, paint, medical waste, dirt/soil, coal/ashes, animal waste, firearms, styrofoam, refrigerators or air conditioners. Liquids such as used oil and grease also should NOT be disposed of in the dumpster.

# Mosquito abatement plan returns again this year

The Glen Isle Improvement Association, Inc. will be included in the county-wide mosquito abatement program led by the Maryland Department of Agriculture. Weekly spraying should begin sometime in May for adult Tiger mosquitoes. GIIA is required to inform residents of mosquito control activities, policies, and spray schedules. Schedules have not yet been assigned to communities. GIIA will distribute the info. to residents (via the website at [www.glenisleestates.com](http://www.glenisleestates.com) and by e-mail).

Note, West Nile encephalitis, eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis and Zika virus are mosquito-borne diseases that can adversely impact human health in Maryland. If any mosquito-borne disease becomes a real or imminent public health threat, adult mosquito control will be a priority issue.

Here is the info. that we'd like to share with residents.

## **Mosquito Control Policy:**

The Maryland Department of Agriculture (Department) provides mosquito control services, in cooperation with participating county governments, as authorized by State law. The Department's preferred mosquito control strategy is the reduction of mosquito larvae numbers by source reduction, biological control agents or use of biological insecticides. Adult mosquito control, by ultra low volume (ULV) application of insecticide, is conducted using aircraft or truck-mounted application equipment in residential areas for nuisance abatement and to protect public health from mosquito-borne disease

## **Operating Procedures for Spraying of Adulticides**

(Treatment for adult mosquitoes):

- Regular Surveillance and Control of Adult Mosquitoes: May 30 – October 2 / Sunday-Thursday  
(A night of the week will be assigned to the community)  
Anytime between 7:00 p.m. - 2:30 a.m.
- Spraying for adult mosquitoes will be done only if a MD Dept. of Agriculture Employee determines it is necessary.
- Spraying will not be conducted during rain, in wind speeds exceeding 12 MPH, or temperatures above 89°F.

An individual may have his/her owned or leased property excluded from nuisance mosquito control. This exclusion will include a buffer of approximately 300 feet around the property. Each individual requesting this exclusion must submit the request in writing to the Department and provide a copy to the appropriate city, town, or county government. The individual may also notify the appropriate community association.

## **Help us to get rid of Mosquito Breeding Sites**

*Please note that ULV spray treatment of adult tiger mosquitoes is most effective when conducted in conjunction with community cleanup efforts. The effective way to control mosquitoes in your neighborhood is at the community level. We encourage homeowners and communities to be proactive in their efforts to control mosquitoes by becoming aware of backyard breeding sites.*

1. Clean rain gutters to allow water to flow freely.
2. Remove old tires or drill drainage holes in tires used for playground equipment.
3. Store plastic wading pools inside or turn them upside down when not in use.
4. Turn over or remove clay pots and plastic containers.
5. Dispose of all empty beverage containers, plastic wrappers, discarded toys, etc.
6. Check for trapped water in plastic or canvas tarps used to cover boats, pools, etc. Arrange the tarp to drain the water.
7. Pump out bilges in boats. Turn canoes and small boats upside down for storage.
8. Replace water in bird baths at least twice a week.
9. Remove pet food and water dishes that are not being used.
10. Flush livestock water troughs twice a week.
11. Don't leave garbage can lids lying upside down. Be sure water does not collect in the bottom of garbage cans.
12. Flush water in the bottom of plant holders twice a week.
13. Fix dripping outside water faucets.
14. Turn wheelbarrows upside down when outside.
15. Check around construction sites or do-it-yourself improvements to ensure that proper backfilling and grading prevent drainage problems.
16. Check ornamental ponds, tree holes and water-holding low areas for mosquito larvae. Call the nearest Mosquito Control Office (see below) if you find, or suspect, mosquito larvae are present.
17. If ditches do not flow and contain stagnant water for one week or longer, they can produce large numbers of mosquitoes. Report such conditions to a Mosquito Control Office. Do not attempt to clear these ditches because they may be protected by wetland regulations.

Community and Associate members may rent a slip on a monthly basis. Fees for a monthly rental have been established at 1/3 the annual rental rate. Members who choose to rent on a monthly basis will be considered temporary tenants, and will not be assigned a permanent slip. Priority will be given to the members who obligate to the annual rental. Upon receipt of three months temporary slip rental fees, no additional fees will be collected for the remainder of that boating season and the member will be assigned a permanent slip. Temporary tenants will have access to the launching ramp for the period of their slip rental. Temporary rental will begin upon the first date of slip usage and run for 30 or 31 days depending on the days in the month.
