## Beach matters for Glen Isle residents

The Beach Committee has been working along with the Glen Isle Improvement Association Board to come up with ideas to resolve issues at the Glen Isle beach areas. The focus of the group is to best maintain the beach properties and to ensure that the beach can remain safe and accessible to all residents.

The Board has been asked to better clarify the policy on groups and gatherings, and has been discussing that issue. They have heard comments from residents about the July 4th beach weekend, with both positive and negative opinions. They are also dealing with infrastructure and environmental planning at the beach.

The committee has been reviewing existing rules and recommending solutions for better enforcement of these rules for the benefit of all GIIA members. If you are not familiar with beach policies, they can be found within the "Community Rules & Regulations" in "Section IV-Beach" in the Glen Isle Directory and on the website. (Boats & Piers have their own set of rules, also in the directory and online.)

At the April meeting, the Board discussed overall beach rules and observed that "everyday" beach policy and holiday beach policies should be handled somewhat separately as they can be very different things. Holidays require more attention to parking and law enforcement, and everything from trash to noise. Did you know that someone has to schedule an extra pick-up for trash and port-a-potty clean-out for our summer

holidays at the beach? And it's a volunteer who takes care of it!

One item of note is that the GIIA Board is going to try a new idea for the holiday weekdays and weekends of Memorial Day, July 4, and Labor Day this year. The Board is asking that NO vehicles without a Glen Isle sticker be parked in the beach area at all. No temporary guest passes and no parking for cars or boat trailers for non-residents. The Board asks for your help in enforcing this.

This was decided upon based on the desire of residents to be able to have parking at their community beach at these busy times.

Any residents who are planning to host events or gatherings at these times at the beach are asked to organize parking for their guests at their homes, or another location.

The main focus here is to work with everyone to make sure the beach is an asset we can all enjoy.

So, we'd like to ask you, the residents, to help us improve the beach and piers. Do you see any problems at the beach area? Do you have any ideas? 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If you use a boat or jet ski at the Glen Isle beach, we ask that you please try to limit your close-to-shore activity at the first beach near the boat launch ramp. The beach erosion situation is being addressed by the GIIA Board and this is one area that we think might offer some help in that matter.

We are hoping that by reducing the number of craft that are pulled up to the sand, we might all reduce some of the damage in the area.

Glen Isle's Clubhouse is now looking great. And the air conditioning/heating units have been a huge success. There is now a safety gate installed at the top of the stairs. Even the bathroom doors recently had new latches installed. There has also been an addition to the threshold out to the patio to allow the chair and table storage carts to enter more easily. It is requested

that all chairs and tables be stored inside the clubhouse between rentals and events.

Future ideas for clubhouse improvement include paying some attention to the flooring, both the wood and the carpeting on stage and steps. And it seems we may soon be due for another coat of paint here and there. # Mosquitoes are coming soon - we have a plan

The Glen Isle Improvement Association, Inc. will be included in the county-wide mosquito abatement program led by the Maryland Department of Agriculture after spending years on a wait list (if testing confirms it is needed). This is good news to many residents who had repeatedly inquired as to this status. GIIA is required to inform residents of mosquito control activities, policies, and spray schedules. A schedule will only be known after it has been assigned. At that time, GIIA will distribute the information to residents.

Note that county-wide larval mosquito control exists separately from adult mosquito control. So a truck may spray on an unknown schedule within the neighborhood.

Also note, West Nile encephalitis, eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis and Zika virus are mosquito-borne diseases that can adversely impact human health in Maryland. If any mosquito-borne disease becomes a real or imminent public health threat, adult mosquito control will be a priority issue.

Here is the info. that we'd like to share with residents.

## Mosquito Control Policy:

The Maryland Department of Agriculture (Department) provides mosquito control services, in cooperation with participating county governments, as authorized by State law. The Department's preferred mosquito control strategy is the reduction of mosquito larvae numbers by source reduction, biological control agents or use of biological insecticides. Adult mosquito control, by ultra low volume (ULV) application of insecticide, is conducted using aircraft or truck-mounted application equipment in



residential areas for nuisance abatement and to protect public health from mosquito-borne disease

## Operating Procedures for Spraying of Adulticides (Treatment for adult mosquitoes):

- Regular Surveillance and Control of Adult Mosquitoes:  
May 31 – October 3 / Sunday-Thursday  
(A night of the week will be assigned to your community)  
Anytime between 7:00 p.m. - 2:30 a.m.
- Spraying for adult mosquitoes will be done only if a Maryland Department of Agriculture Employee determines it is necessary.
- Spraying will not be conducted during rain, in wind speeds exceeding 12 MPH, or temperatures above 89°F.

An individual may have his/her owned or leased property excluded from nuisance mosquito control. This exclusion will include a buffer of approximately 300 feet around the property. Each individual requesting this exclusion must submit the request in writing to the Department and provide a copy to the appropriate city, town, or county government. The individual may also notify the appropriate community association.

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## Tips to Rid Your Community of Mosquito Breeding Sites

*Please note that ULV spray treatment of adult tiger mosquitoes is most effective when conducted in conjunction with community cleanup efforts. The effective way to control mosquitoes in your neighborhood is at the community level. We encourage home owners and communities to be proactive in their efforts to control mosquitoes by becoming aware of backyard breeding sites.*

1. Clean rain gutters to allow water to flow freely.
2. Remove old tires or drill drainage holes in tires used for playground equipment.
3. Store plastic wading pools inside or turn them upside down when not in use.
4. Turn over or remove clay pots and plastic containers.
5. Dispose of all empty beverage containers, plastic wrappers, discarded toys, etc.
6. Check for trapped water in plastic or canvas tarps used to cover boats, pools, etc. Arrange the tarp to drain the water.
7. Pump out bilges in boats. Turn canoes and small boats upside down for storage.
8. Replace water in bird baths at least twice a week.
9. Remove pet food and water dishes that are not

being used.

10. Flush livestock water troughs twice a week.
  11. Don't leave garbage can lids lying upside down. Be sure water does not collect in the bottom of garbage cans.
  12. Flush water in the bottom of plant holders twice a week.
  13. Fix dripping outside water faucets.
  14. Turn wheelbarrows upside down when stored outside.
  15. Check around construction sites or do-it-yourself improvements to ensure that proper backfilling and grading prevent drainage problems.
  16. Check ornamental ponds, tree holes and water-holding low areas for mosquito larvae. Call the nearest Mosquito Control Office (see below) if you find, or suspect, mosquito larvae are present.
  17. If ditches do not flow and contain stagnant water for one week or longer, they can produce large numbers of mosquitoes. Report such conditions to a Mosquito Control Office. Do not attempt to clear these ditches because they may be protected by wetland regulations.
